**Title:** Additional agreement between the government of the union of soviet socialist republics and central people's government of the Chinese people's republic to the treaty on friendship, alliance, and mutual assistance between the USSR and CPR

In connection with the signature on this date by the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the USSR and Central People's Government of the Chinese People's Republic of the Treaty on Friendship, Alliance, and Mutual Assistance and in the interests of ensuring the defense of both countries, the Government of the USSR and Central People's Government of the Chinese People's Republic have agreed on the present Additional Agreement.

Rights to concessions will not be granted to foreigners either on the territory of the Far Eastern territory and Central Asian Republics of the USSR or on the territory of Manchuria and Sinkiang of the Chinese People's Republic and the activity of industrial, financial, trade, and other enterprises, institutions, societies, and organizations with the participation in direct or indirect form of the capital of third countries or citizens of these countries will not be permitted.

Done at the City of Moscow, 14 February 1950, in two examples, each in the Russian and Chinese languages, both texts being equally authentic.

**Remark**

Beijing requested that a group of delegates from Xinjiang come to Moscow to help smooth the negotiating process. As a result, Ma Hanbing, along with Säypiddin Äzizi (赛福鼎), Deng Liqun (邓力群), Chen Xihua (陈锡华), and Hu-sai-yin Mu-la-tuo-fu (胡赛音-木拉托夫), traveled to Moscow for the Sino-Soviet Summit.
