REPORT ON THE SIGNING IN MOSCOW OF PROTOCOLS CONCERNING SINO-SOVIET TRADE RELATIONS AND THE AGREEMENT ON SOVIET ASSISTANCE TO THE PRC IN EXPANDING EXISTING AND CONSTRUCTING NEW POWER PLANTS

March 26, 1953

As a result of negotiations between the **Ministry of Internal and Foreign Trade of the USSR** and the **trade delegation of the People's Republic of China**, which took place in an atmosphere of friendly mutual understanding, the following agreements were recently signed:

- Protocol on Trade Turnover between the USSR and the PRC for 1953
- Protocol to the Agreement on the Provision of a Loan to the PRC dated February 14, 1950
- Agreement on Soviet Assistance to China in Expanding Existing and Constructing New Power Plants

The signed protocols provide for the **further expansion of trade** between the **USSR and China** and include deliveries from the Soviet Union to China of equipment for the **metallurgical**, **mining**, **machine-building**, **chemical**, **and energy industries**, as well as **materials for industry and** transportation, **modern agricultural machinery**, **breeding livestock**, **seeds**, **and a range of other goods**.

In turn, China will supply the Soviet Union in 1953 with non-ferrous metals, rice, vegetable oils, oilseeds, meat, tobacco, tea, fruits, wool, jute, raw silk, silk fabrics, leather raw materials, and other commodities.

The protocols and the agreement were signed by:

- From the Soviet side A.I. Mikoyan, Minister of Internal and Foreign Trade of the USSR
- From the Chinese side Ye Jizhuang, Minister of Foreign Trade and Deputy Chairman of the Financial and Economic Committee of the State Administrative Council, and Li Fuchun, Deputy Chairman of the Financial and Economic Committee

Present at the signing of these agreements were:

- From the Chinese side Zhou Enlai, Premier of the State Administrative Council and Minister of Foreign Affairs of the PRC; Zhang Wentian, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the PRC to the USSR; Li Qiang, Trade Counselor of the Chinese Embassy; members of the Chinese trade delegation; and staff of the Chinese Embassy
- From the Soviet side Y.A. Malik, Deputy Minister of Foreign Affairs of the USSR; P.N. Kumykin and S.A. Borisov, Deputy Ministers of Internal and Foreign Trade of the USSR; V.V. Kuznetsov, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of the USSR to the PRC; as well as senior officials from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Ministry of Internal and Foreign Trade of the USSR.
