He Cheng: 'A Summary of Health Work over the past Four Years and its Future Direction and Tasks'

The report concerning Chinese medical issues was entitled 'Increasing Chinese Medical Work, and Putting the Strength of Chinese Medicine to Full Use' this report emphasized the need to increase the proportion of Chinese medicine-related classes in the curriculum of these schools. The report also emphasized the importance of the continued promotion of acupuncture, the policy of 'uniting' Chinese medicine and encouraging the people to treat the Chinese medical profession with respect. In addition, it brought Chinese medical herbs onto the agenda and stressed the importance of supporting the Chinese herbal market, which was currently very much in decline. Thus the main message by the end of 1953 still lay in the 'improvement' of Chinese medicine within Schools for the Further Education of Chinese Medical Practitioners.
